How can I let someone know that I may require assistance or accommodations to find a vaccine, make an appointment, fill out forms and/or complete any part of the process to get the vaccine?

If going to a DPH standing vaccine site, contact the DPH Vaccine Call Center at <u>1-833-643-</u> <u>1715</u> (press option 3) or email <u>vaccine@delaware.gov</u> with requests regarding accommodations needed at the vaccination site. If you have a disability and need an accommodation for a vaccination appointment you have already made, you can also call the Aging and Disability Resource Center at <u>1-800-223-9074</u>. You can also call the DPH Vaccine Call Center with general questions about where to get vaccinated.

How can I get vaccinated if I am unable to leave home due to disability, age or severe illness?

DHSS' Homebound Vaccination Program can bring the vaccine or boosters to Delawareans who qualify. Vaccinations are being scheduled and delivered through a partnership with Delaware independent pharmacies. **To be assessed, please call** <u>1-888-491-4988</u>.

How can I access the vaccine if I do not drive/have transportation?

Eligible Delaware Medicaid clients in need of non-emergency transportation should contact Modivcare at <u>1-866-412-3778</u>. You can also contact your case manager from your Managed Care Organization (Highmark or Amerihealth Caritas) for assistance with Modivcare transportation.

For Seniors look for the walk-ins. It is also best to go to call your family health care provider first. They know your medical history and can set you up for a physician's visit at the same time as the test if you are having symptoms where this is advisable. Their nurses can do a quick and simple test if you do not need to see the provider. This can be a fast way to be tested.
